Note: The Greek word translated “gentleness” or “meekness” is *praotetos*, which refers to an inner state and is associated with accepting God’s will calmly and with trust (it appears 9 times in scripture; this list includes synonyms as well). In Hebrew, “meek” or “gentle” is usually translated from *anav*, which also means “humble.”
